#### **EXPLANATION**

As a Program Assistant for the Drinking Water and Groundwater Bureau at the Department of Environmental Services, Ms. Couture has the pleasure to work with communities and public water

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systems to develop, publish and distribute to the public a summary of their water quality results through the annual consumer confidence report. The consumer confidence reports are a cornerstone of the Federal and State Drinking Water Acts, as they ensure the public is provided access to data that describes the quality of their drinking water. The reports are required to provide the information to the general public in a manner that can be easily understood. As a point of contact for public water systems and the general public regarding drinking water quality, it is necessary for Ms. Couture to stay current with many of the aspects in line with the University of Southern New Hampshire's Master of Public Health (MPH) degree.

Ms. Couture is required to sign a contract, which obligates her to work for the State for six months after satisfactory completion of each class. The agreement does require her to obtain a passing grade. If she does not comply with terms of the contract, she will be liable for returning the amount paid. The program is directly related to her responsibilities as the Program Assistant overseeing water quality consumer confidence reports for the Drinking Water and Groundwater Bureau and the technical assistance that she provides to water systems and communities around the State of New Hampshire.

Tuition assistance has been a very successful program of the department and has resulted in many benefits to the State. The cost is minimal when compared to the cost of salary and benefits. The courses being taken relate to the individual and her job accountabilities, and we encourage our staff to further develop their skills so they can keep up with the latest developments in their work. We have encouraged Ms. Couture to take these courses as part of our professional development plan.

	The State and the Recipient do hereby mutually agree as follows:
1.	The State shall pay to the named institution the sum of

	shall commence on <u>January 30</u> 20 23 and terminate on <u>April 9</u> 20 23
2.	The Recipient shall complete and achieve a passing grade in each course named in paragraph 1.
3.	Should the Recipient fail to complete and achieve a passing grade in each course named in paragraph 1, the amount which shall be paid to the State shall be calculated on a pro rata basis.
4.	Upon the satisfactory completion of the courses named in paragraph 1, the Recipient shall continue in the employ of the State in his/her current position (or in such other position, at equal or greater compensation, to which he/she may be assigned) for a period of Six (6) Months for each class.
5.	The Recipient shall work in any area of the State to which he/she may be assigned, provided that such assignment will not constitute a severe hardship to said Recipient.
6.	Should the Recipient breach any of the conditions set forth in paragraphs 4 and 5, the Recipient shall pay to the State a sum equal to all monies previously paid by the State for the Recipient pursuant to the Agreement, provided, however, that the Recipient shall receive a credit for each month in which he/she is employed by the State subsequent to the date upon
