EXPLANATION

These grant funds will be used by the New Hampshire State Police Forensic Laboratory (NHSPFL) to fund overtime as well as continuing educational training requirements of the analysts who primarily work in the Firearms/Toolmarks, Identification, Management and Quality Assurance sections. The NH State Police Forensic Laboratory (NHSPFL) is the sole provider of forensic services within the state for over 220 municipal police departments, nine state law enforcement agencies including the State Police, ten county sheriff departments, numerous city and town fire departments, and, on occasion, federal law enforcement agencies conducting criminal investigations in the state. Services offered include firearms/tool marks, pattern evidence, biology, digital evidence, fire debris, controlled drug, toxicology and breath alcohol testing.

Although the Department included this grant in the SFY 2022 and SFY 2023 budget, the amount of the Federal grant received was higher than expected, therefore requiring the above requested action.

Additional funds are to be budgeted as follows:

Funds in Class 018, Overtime, are needed to reduce the backlog of analysis.

Funds in Class 020, Current Expenses, are needed to pay for the certification of the State Laboratory.

Funds in Class 040, Indirect Cost, are needed to pay Administrative Services on eligible expenses.

Funds in Class 066, Employee Training, are needed for continuing educational training for Lab personnel.

Funds in Class 080, Out-of-State Travel, are needed for continuing educational training for Lab personnel.

In the event that federal pass-through funds become no longer available, General Funds and/or Highway Funds will not be requested to support this program.

REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Justice (DOJ) to amend an existing subgrant with the New Hampshire Department of Safety (DOS), Concord, NH (Vendor #311206-B001), approved by the Governor and Executive Council on June 2, 2021, item #119, paragraph #2, from the Federal Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant Program, by extending the <u>end date only</u> from September 30, 2022, to September 30, 2023, for the purpose of funding drug analyst overtime, lab personnel training, and lab certification maintenance, effective upon Governor and Executive Council approval through September 30, 2023. No additional funds are involved in this time extension.

EXPLANATION

The Paul Coverdell Forensic Sciences Improvement Grants Program is a formula grant created by Public Law 106-561 on December 21, 2000. The intent of the program is to provide funding to improve quality, timeliness, and credibility of forensic services. The DOJ receives this funding annually from the Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice Assistance.

The DOS, New Hampshire State Police Forensic Laboratory (Forensic Laboratory) is the sole provider of forensic laboratory services in New Hampshire. It delivers lab services, free of charge, to all law enforcement agencies conducting investigations anywhere within the State's borders. Because of this, there is a high demand for DOS lab services.

This subgrant time extension will allow the DOS to continue to fund overtime for Forensic Laboratory Drug Analysts, certification from the American Society of Crime Lab Directors (ASCLD/LAB), and training to enhance personnel skills.
