**REQUESTED ACTION**

Pursuant to RSA 198:15-y, III, I respectfully request approval to **retroactively** amend expenditure authorization from the Public-School Infrastructure Fund for school security improvement projects originally approved by the Executive Council on September 7, 2022 (Item #43) and Fiscal Committee on September 9, 2022 (Item #FIS 22-303) by extending the end date from June 30, 2023 to June 30, 2025, effective upon Fiscal Committee and Executive Council approval. 100% General Funds.

**EXPLANATION**

This item is **retroactive** due to the request needing to be held until after the new fiscal year, when the Fiscal Committee would then have the authority to approve items for the FY24-25 biennium. The original accept and expend item was approved through June 30, 2023, as the request was only able to be submitted through the end of the FY22-23 biennium at that time.

RSA 198:15-y created the Public School Infrastructure Commission and the Public School Infrastructure Fund with the purpose of providing funding for infrastructure projects for public elementary and secondary schools. The law allows for several categories of projects to be eligible for aid through the Public School Infrastructure Fund. One such category is "funding for the department of safety, division of homeland security and emergency management's school emergency readiness program to improve security in public schools, after the completion of a security assessment, and in consultation with municipal officials."

With the intent of improving security in NH schools, the Public School Infrastructure Commission developed and approved a Security Action for Education (SAFE) grant application that schools could use to apply for grant funds for eligible projects. The Commission agreed upon three general project categories that would be eligible for SAFE grant funding. These categories are access control, surveillance, and emergency alerting. In order for a project to be eligible for funding, the proposed activity was required to fall under one of these three categories. Eligible projects were capped at \$100,000 per school.

Schools submitted applications to the Commission through the Homeland Security and Emergency Management's (HSEM's) portal, and HSEM then ranked the submitted applications based on a risk assessment. There were 168 applications from 92 public schools approved for funding by Governor and Council on September 7, 2022 (Item #43) and Fiscal Committee on September 9, 2022 (Item #FIS 22-303).

These SAFE grant recipients have until December 31, 2024 to expend all funds and complete all approved project activities. As of this request, all projects remain open and active. To date, \$1,099,369.72 of the total \$3,859,917.46 approved grant funding has been reimbursed to grantees, with the remaining \$2,760,547.74 pending expenditure.

Approval of this extension will allow NHED to continue to reimburse New Hampshire public schools for the school security improvement grant awards previously approved by Fiscal Committee and Governor and Executive Council.

**REQUESTED ACTION**

Pursuant to RSA 198:15-y, III, I respectfully request approval to authorize expenditures from the Public School Infrastructure Fund in the amount of \$3,859,917.46 for school security improvement projects with the attached list of public elementary and secondary schools, contingent upon availability of funds per RSA 198:15-y, effective upon Fiscal Committee and Governor and Council approval through June 30, 2023. 100% General Funds.

Funds are available in the account titled; Public School Infrastructure Fund as follows:

**EXPLANATION**

RSA 198:15-y created the Public School Infrastructure Commission and the Public School Infrastructure Fund with the purpose of providing funding for infrastructure projects for public elementary and secondary schools. The law allows for several categories of projects to be eligible for aid through the Public School Infrastructure Fund. One such category is "funding for the department of safety, division of homeland security and emergency management's school emergency readiness program to improve security in public schools, after the completion of a security assessment, and in consultation with municipal officials."

With the intent of improving security in NH schools, the Public School Infrastructure Commission developed and approved a Security Action for Education (SAFE) grant application that schools could use to apply for grant funds for eligible projects. The Commission agreed upon three general project categories

that would be eligible for SAFE grant funding. These categories are access control, emergency alerting, and surveillance. In order for a project to be eligible for funding, the proposed activity was required to fall under one of these three categories. Eligible projects were also capped at \$100,000 per school.

Schools submitted applications to the Commission through the Department of Safety, Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management's (HSEM) School Resource Center, and HSEM then reviewed the submitted applications to assess potential risk based on a scoring rubric with five questions which were included as part of the application. The results of scoring rubric indicated the lower the score, the higher the risk. The highest potential score was a 7.0, and the average score was 5.9.

The applications were then ranked by risk and placement into one of five tiers; which resulted in 177 applications from 92 schools recommended for funding. The Commission reviewed and approved the HSEM ranking and project funding recommendations. Having consulted with the Commission, I am requesting authorization to expend funds for the attached list of projects.
