#### REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Environmental Services to amend an American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) **SOLE SOURCE** grant (PO #1092905) with the Town of Atkinson, NH (VC# 177232-B003), by increasing the grant limitation by \$100,000 to \$400,000, from \$300,000, for a water main extension. The original grant was approved by Governor and Executive Council on May 31, 2023, Item #106. 100% Federal Funds.

#### **EXPLANATION**

The requested action is **SOLE SOURCE**, since the amendment will increase the grant amount by more than 10%. We are requesting approval of this amendment to provide the Town of Atkinson additional grant funding to complete a water main extension that will improve water quality issues. The construction bid amount came in higher than what was anticipated. This additional funding will allow the Town to cover the additional construction, engineering, and contingency costs.

NHDES approved \$300,000 in grant funding for the Town of Atkinson to remediate per- and poly-fluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) by extending water main from a public water system and providing service connections to identified properties that have been affected by aqueous film forming foams used by the Atkinson Fire Department. Grant funds will be used for the required environmental review, engineering design, construction of water main and service connections, decommissioning of contaminated wells and associated infrastructure, engineering design and construction phase observation and other associated eligible project costs. This is an allowable use of ARP FRF funds under Section 602 (c)(1)(D) to make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure.

To date, \$0 of the original \$300,000 grant has been spent. If federal funds become no longer available, General Funds will not be requested to support this program. This grant agreement has been approved by the Attorney General's Office as to form, substance, and execution.

# Grant Agreement with the Town of Atkinson American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Grant Amendment No. 1

This Agreement (hereinafter called the Amendment) dated this 5 day of 5 day of 5 day of 2023, is by and between the State of New Hampshire, acting by and through its Department of Environmental Services (hereinafter referred to as the State) and the Town of Atkinson acting by and through its Town Administrator, John Apple (hereinafter referred to as the Grantee).

WHEREAS, pursuant to an Agreement (hereinafter called the Agreement) approved by the Governor and Council on May 31, 2023, the Grantee agreed to perform certain services upon the terms and conditions specified in the Agreement and in consideration of payment by the State of certain sums as specified therein; and

WHEREAS, The Grantee and the State have agreed to amend the Agreement in certain respects;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, and the covenants and conditions contained in the Agreement and set forth herein, the parties hereto do hereby agree as follows:

- Amendment and Modification of Agreement: The Agreement is hereby amended as follows:
  - (A) The Grant Limitation as set forth in sub-paragraph 1.8 of the Agreement shall be changed to \$400,000, from \$300,000.
  - (B) The grant award as set forth in the third paragraph of Exhibit C shall be changed to \$400,000, from \$300,000.
- 2. <u>Effective Date of Amendment</u>; This Amendment shall take effect upon the date of approval of this Amendment by the Governor and Executive Council of the State of New Hampshire.
- Continuance of Agreement: Except as specifically amended and modified by the terms and conditions of this Amendment, the Agreement, and the obligations of the parties thereunder, shall remain in full force and effect in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth therein.

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

A Certificate of Vote of Authorization (COV) is a certificate that states that a grantee is willing to enter into a grant agreement with the State of NH Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) and that whoever signs the Grant Agreement (provided under separate cover) has the authority to do so. **Do not complete this form until you have received a Grant Agreement from NHDES. Follow the steps below**:

- 1. Following a funding offer from NHDES, obtain the authority to accept grant funds and assign an Authorized Representative (AR) from the grantees governing body. #### CERTIFICATE OF COVERAGE

The New Hampshire Public Risk Management Exchange (Primex³) is organized under the New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, Chapter 5-B, Pooled Risk Management Programs. General Liability coverage is limited to Coverage A (Personal Injury Liability) and Coverage's C (Public Officials Errors and Omissions), D (Unfair Employment Practices), € (Employee Benefit Liability) and F (Educator's Legal Liability Claims-Made Coverage) are excluded from this provision of coverage.



#### **EXPLANATION**

The grant is funded through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021. ARPA is a \$1.9 trillion economic stimulus bill passed by the 117<sup>th</sup> United States Congress and signed into law by President Biden on March 11, 2021, to speed up the United States' recovery from the economic and health effects of the COVID-19 pandemic and the resultant recession. The Act defines eligible uses of the state and local funding, including responding to public health emergencies, responding to workers performing essential work during the COVID-19 emergency, providing revenue relief to states and making investments in water, sewer, and broadband infrastructure. ARPA provides funding for costs incurred after March 3, 2021. Grant and loan applications are accepted year-round and reviewed for eligibility in the order in which the applications are received.

NHDES approved grant funding up to \$300,000 for the Town of Atkinson to remediate per- and poly-fluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) by extending water main from a public water system and providing service connections to identified properties that have been affected by aqueous film forming foams used by the Atkinson Fire Department. Grant funds will be used for the required environmental review, engineering design, construction of water main and service connections, decommissioning of contaminated wells and associated infrastructure, engineering design and construction phase observation and other associated eligible project costs. This is an allowable use of ARP FRF funds under Section 602 (c)(1)(D) to make necessary investments in water, sewer, or broadband infrastructure.

2. SCOPE OF WORK: In exchange for grant funds provided by the State of New Hampshire, acting through the Agency identified in block 1.1 (hereinafter referred to as "the State"), the Grantee identified in block 1.3 (hereinafter referred to as "the Grantee"), shall perform that work identified and more particularly described in the scope of work attached hereto as EXHIBIT B (the scope of work being hereinafter referred to as "the Project").

AREA COVERED Except as otherwise specifically provided for herein, the Grantee shall perform the Project in and with respect to the State of New

EFFECTIVE DATE: COMPLETION OF PROJECT.

This Agreement, and 'all 'obligations' of the parties hereunder, shall become effective on the date on the date of approval of this Agreement by the Governor and Council of the State of New Hampshire if required (block 1.16), or upon 9.3. signature by the State Agency as shown in block 1.14 ("the Effective Date"

Except as otherwise specifically provided herein, the Project, including all reports ; 9.4.8 required by this Agreement, shall be completed in ITS entirety prior to the date in

block 1.7 (hereinafter referred to as "the Completion Date").

GRANT AMOUNT: LIMITATION ON AMOUNT: VOUCHERS: PAYMENT. The Grant Amount is identified and more particularly described in EXHIBIT.C

The manner of, and schedule of payment shall be as set forth in EXHIBIT C

In accordance with the provisions set forth in EXHIBIT C, and in consideration of the satisfactory performance of the Project, as determined by the State, and as limited by subparagraph 5.5 of these general provisions, the State shall pay the Grantee the Grant Amount. The State shall withhold from the amount otherwise payable to the Grantee under this subparagraph 5.3 those sums required, or permitted, to be withheld pursuant to N.H. RSA 80.7 through 7-c.?

The payment by the State of the Grant amount shall be the only, and the complete payment to the Grantee for all expenses, of whatever nature, incurred by the Grantee in the performance hereof, and shall be the only, and the complete, compensation to the Grantee for the Project. The State shall have no liabilities to 11

the Grantee other than the Grant Amount.

Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, and notwithstanding unexpected circumstances, in no event shall the total of all payments authorized. or actually made, hereunder exceed the Grant limitation set forth in block 1.8 of 11.1.2 these general provisions.

COMPLIANCE-BY GRANTEE WITH LAWS AND REGULATIONS In 11.1.4 connection with the performance of the Project, the Grantee shall comply with all 11.2. statutes, laws regulations, and orders of federal, state, county, or municipal authorities which shall impose any obligations or duty upon the Grantee, including the acquisition of any and all necessary permits and RSA 31-95-b.

RECORDS and ACCOUNTS.

Between the Effective Date and the date seven (7) years after the Completion Date, unless otherwise required by the grant terms or the Agency, the Grantee shall keep detailed accounts of all expenses incurred in connection with the 11.2.2 Project, including, but not limited to, costs of administration, transportation, insurance, telephone calls, and elerical materials and services. Such accounts shall be supported by receipts, involces, bills and other similar documents.

Between the Effective Date and the date seven (7) years after the Completion Date, unless otherwise required by the grant terms or the Agency pursuant to subparagraph 7.1, at any time during the Grantee's normal business hours, and as often as the State shall demand, the Grantee shall make available to the State all records pertaining to matters covered by this Agreement. The Grantee shall permit the State to audit, examine, and reproduce such records, and to make audits of all contracts, invoices, materials, payrolls, records of personnel, data (as that 12.1. term is hereinafter defined), and other information relating to all matters covered by this Agreement. As used in this paragraph, "Grantee" includes all persons, natural or fictional, affiliated with, controlled by, or under common ownership

with, the entity identified as the Grantee in block 1.3 of these provisions

PERSONNEL

The Grantee shall, at its own expense, provide all personnel necessary to perform 12.2. the Project. The Grantee warrants that all personnel engaged in the Project shall be qualified to perform such Project, and shall be properly licensed and authorized to perform such Project under all applicable laws.

The Grantee shall not hire, and it shall not permit any subcontractor, subgrantee, 12.3 or other person, firm or corporation with whom it is engaged in a combined effort to perform the Project, to hire any person who has a contractual relationship with

the State, or who is a State officer or employee, elected or appointed. The Grant Officer shall be the representative of the State bereunder. In the event of any dispute hereunder, the interpretation of this Agreement by the Grant: 12.4.

DATA: RETENTION OF DATA: ACCESS:

As used in this Agreement, the word "data" shall mean all information and things 13. developed or obtained during the performance of, or acquired or developed by reason of, this Agreement, including, but not limited to, all studies, reports, files, formulae, surveys, maps, charts, sound recordings, video recordings, pictorial reproductions, drawings, analyses, graphic representations,

Between the Effective Date and the Completion Date the Grantee shall grant to the State, or any person designated by it unrestricted access to all data for examination, duplication, publication, translation, sale, disposal, or for any other

anyone other than the State.

On and after the Effective Date all data, and any property which has been received. from the State or purchased with finds provided for that purpose under this Agreement, shall be the property of the State, and shall be returned to the State upon demand or upon termination of this Agreement for any reason, whichever

The State, and anyone it shall designate, shall have unrestricted authority to publish; disclose, distribute and otherwise use, in whole or in part, all data

CONDITIONAL NATURE OR AGREEMENT Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, all obligations of the State hereunder, including, without limitation, the continuance of payments hereunder, are contingent upon the availability or continued appropriation of funds, and in no event shall the State be liable for any payments hereunder in excess of such available or appropriated funds. In the event of a reduction or termination of those funds, the State shall have the right to withhold payment until such funds become available, if ever, and shall have the right to terminate this Agreement immediately upon giving the Grantee notice of such termination.

EVENT OF DEFAULT: REMEDIES

- Any one or more of the following acts or omissions of the Grantee shall constitute an event of default hereunder (hereinafter referred to as "Events of Default"):
- Failure to perform the Project satisfactorily or on schedule; or

Failure to submit any report required hereunder; or

- Failure to maintain, or permit access to, the records required hereunder; or
- Failure to perform any of the other covenants and conditions of this Agreement. Upon the occurrence of any Event of Default, the State may take any one, or more,
- or all, of the following actions:
- Give the Grantee a written notice specifying the Event of Default and requiring it to be remedied within, in the absence of a greater or lesser specification of time, thirty (30) days from the date of the notice, and if the Event of Default is not timely remedied, terminate this Agreement, effective two (2) days after giving the Grantee notice of termination; and
- Give the Grantee a written notice specifying the Event of Default and suspending all payments to be made under this Agreement and ordering that the portion of the Grant Amount which would otherwise accrue to the Grantee during the period from the date of such notice until such time as the State determines that the Grantce has cured the Event of Default shall never be paid to the Grantee; and
- Set off against any other obligation the State may owe to the Grantee any damages the State suffers by reason of any Event of Default; and
- Treat the agreement as breached and pursue any of its remedies at law or in equity. or both.

TERMINATION.

- In the event of any early termination of this Agreement for any reason other than the completion of the Project, the Grantee shall deliver to the Grant Officer, not later than fifteen (15) days after the date of termination, a report (hereinafter referred to as the "Termination Report") describing in detail all Project Work performed, and the Grant Amount earned, to and including the date of termination. In the event of Termination under paragraphs 10 or: 12.4 of these general provisions, the approval of such a Termination Report by the State shall entitle
- the Grantee to receive that portion of the Grant amount earned to and including the date of termination.
- In the event of Termination under paragraphs 10 or 12.4 of these general provisions, the approval of such a Termination Report by the State shall in no event relieve the Grantee from any and all liability for damages sustained or incurred by the State as a result of the Grantee's breach of its obligations
- Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, either the State or, except where notice default has been given to the Grantee hereunder, the Grantee, may terminate this Agreement without cause upon thirty (30) days written notice. CONFLICT OF INTEREST. INDEMNIFICATION. WAIVER OF BREACH. No failure by the State to enforce any provisions hereof after any Event of Default shall be deemed a waiver of its rights with regard to that Event, or any subsequent Event. No express waiver of any Event of Default shall be deemed a waiver of any provisions hereof. No such failure of waiver shall be deemed a waiver of the right of the State to enforce each and all of the provisions hereof upon any further or other default on the part of the Grantee

NOTICE. Any notice by a party hereto to the other party shall be deemed to have been duly delivered or given at the time of mailing by certified mail, postage prepaid, in a United States Post Office addressed to the parties at the addresses first above given.

AMENDMENT. This Agreement may be amended, waived or discharged only by an instrument in writing signed by the parties hereto and only after approval of such amendment, waiver or discharge by the Governor and Council of the State of New Hampshire, if required or by the signing State Agency.

CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT AND TERMS. This Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the law of the State of New Hampshire, and is binding upon and inures to the benefit of the parties and their respective successors and assignces. The captions and contents of the "subject" blank are used only as a matter of convenience, and are not to be considered a part of this Agreement or to be used in determining the intend of the parties hereto.

THERD PARTIES The parties hereto do not intend to benefit any third parties and this Agreement shall not be construed to confer any such benefit.

ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement, which may be executed in a number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties, and supersedes all prior agreements and understandings relating hereto.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS. The additional or modifying provisions set forth in Exhibit A hereto are incorporated as part of this agreement

- 5. Drug-Free Workplace. The Contractor shall comply with the terms of 2 CFR part 1329 which require that as a condition of the Agreement, certification that they maintain a drug-free workplace. ## EXHIBIT B SCOPE OF SERVICES

The Town of Atkinson will use grant funds to remediate per- and poly-fluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) by extending water main from a public water system and providing service, connections to identified properties that have been affected by aqueous film forming foams used by the Atkinson Fire Department. Grant funds, will be used for the required environmental review engineering design, construction of water main and service connections, decommissioning of contaminated wells and associated infrastructure, engineering design and construction phase observation and other associated eligible project costs.

This Agreement consists of the following documents: Exhibits A, B, C, and attachments, which are all incorporated herein by reference as if fully set forth herein.

## EXHÍBIT C BUDGET & PAYMENT METHOD

The NHDES shall pay to the Grantee the total reimbursable program costs in accordance with the following requirements:

Reimbursement requests for program costs shall be made no more than once per calendar month by the Grantee using the Request for Disbursement form as supplied by the NHDES, which shall be completed and signed by the Grantee. The disbursement form shall be accompanied by proper supporting documentation based upon direct costs. The Grantee will maintain adequate documentation to substantiate all Program related costs. All work shall be performed to the satisfaction of the NHDES before payment is made.

The total reimbursement shall not exceed the grant award of \$300,000. Each disbursement request for costs incurred after March 3, 2021, will be paid 100% grant funds up to \$300,000.

Changes to the Scope of Services require NHDES approval in advance. Work must be completed and request for reimbursement must be made by the completion date listed on the grant agreement (section 1.7).
