## **EXPLANATION**

The potential consequences of cyber incidents threaten national security. Strengthening cybersecurity practices and resilience of state, local, and territorial (SLT) governments is an important homeland security mission and the primary focus of the State and Local Cybersecurity Grant Program (SLCGP). The SLCGP funds targeted cybersecurity investments in government agencies, thus improving the security of critical infrastructure and improving the resilience of the services governments provide their community. Representatives from cities, towns, and counties, rural, suburban, and urban; higher education and K-12 Public Education; public health and public safety are represented on the New Hampshire SLCGP Planning Committee and collaborated to develop the SLCGP Cybersecurity Plan with goals and objectives that have champions identified to ensure completion. These goals and objectives focus on leveraging economies of scale to implement programs that directly benefit the represented entities on the SLCGP Planning Committee.

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Funds will be used to procure and distribute tokens for use by entities to implement multifactor authentication; procure contracts for cybersecurity training statewide to validate knowledge of basic security concepts, communication security, infrastructure security, cryptography and operational security; and to procure professional services for implementation of tokens as well as transition to the .gov domain.

Funds were not budgeted in FY24 because the details surrounding grant program administration were in development. Program administration has since been agreed upon between the Department of Information Technology and the Department of Safety necessitating this Accept and Expend request at this time.

Funds are to be budgeted in the following accounts:

Funds are available to fund the overtime expenses associated with managing and administering this grant program.
Funds are available to fund the consumable supplies needed to manage and administer this grant program.
Funds are available to fund the .1% Audit Fund Set Aside for this grant program
Funds are available to fund 14.22% Indirect Costs associated with this grant program
Funds are available to fund the benefits associated with the overtime expenses needed to manage and administer the 2022 SLCPG funds.
Funds are available to sub-award to the Department of Information Technology as described in the attached award documents to equip eligible state and local entities with cybersecurity enhancements statewide.

Highway Funds or General Funds will not be used should federal funds become unavailable.
