REQUESTED ACTION

Authorize the Department of Education to enter into a **Sole Source** amendment to an existing Cooperative Project Agreement (CPA) with Granite State College, (VC# 315187) Concord, NH by increasing the price limitation by \$336,123.24 from \$609,606.82 to \$945,730.06, and extending the end date from December 15, 2023 to December 15, 2024, effective upon Governor and Council approval. The original CPA was approved by the Governor and Council on September 15, 2021, item #70G, amended on December 08, 2021, item #72, and amended on October 4, 2022, item #36, and amended December 7, 2022, item #74. 42.90% General Fund, 46.11% Federal Funds and 10.99% Other Funds.

Funds to support this request are available in the following accounts for FY24 and FY25, with the authority to adjust encumbrances between fiscal years within the price limitation through the Budget Office, without further Governor and Council approval, if needed and justified.

EXPLANATION

This request is **Sole Source** because the original agreement was also **Sole Source** due to ongoing asbestos removal at the Department's Londergan Hall location. This amendment will exercise the final extension of the agreement through December 15, 2024.

The New Hampshire Department of Education's (NHED) main building is Londergan Hall at 101 Pleasant Street, Concord. During the summer of 2021, the Department of Administrative Services initiated an abatement project that resulted in the NHED temporarily moving staff to Johnson Hall, Walker Building, Hotel Concord and entering into a cooperative project agreement with Granite State College, located at 25 Hall Street, for the use of temporary office space. As the project commenced, additional asbestos in the ceilings and pipes were identified, resulting in an expansion of the project. Additionally, the legislature approved funding to upgrade the bathrooms to be compliant with the Americans Disability Act; and the Department of Administrative Services initiated upgrading the elevator. All of these projects have extended the overall project completion date; with the most recent change being that the FY 24/25 capital budget approved by the Legislature and Governor included funding to purchase 25 Hall Street. NHED is now requesting approval to amend the agreement with Granite State College for on-going office and conference room space on a month-to-month basis while the Department of Administrative Services finalizes the purchase of the building.

The rental rate in the cooperative project agreement is inclusive heat, air conditioning, sewer, water, electricity, real estate taxes, insurance, janitorial, snow plowing and removal, parking and building site maintenance.

- A. Project Title: Asbestos Abatement Office Space Rental Project
- **B.** Project Period: December 16, 2023 to December 15, 2024.
- **C. Objectives:** To provide office and meeting space for State workers displaced from NHED Londergan Hall due to that site's ongoing asbestos abatement.
- **D.** Scope of Work: University of New Hampshire ("COLLEGE") (VC# 315187) shall provide: 23,430 square feet ("sf"), comprised of 3,534 sf on First Floor, 3,444sf on the Second Floor, 12,175sf on the Third Floor and 4,277sf on the LL Floor. COLLEGE shall also provide, heat, air conditioning, sewer and water service, electricity, real estate taxes, insurance, janitorial services, snow plowing and removal, and building and site maintenance for the Office Space (the "Services").
- **E.** Deliverables Schedule: State shall have use of the Office Space and the attendant Services beginning on December 16, 2023, and continuing through December 15, 2024.
- **F.** Budget and Invoicing Instructions: Payment is to be made on invoices for the set amount of \$28,010.27 per month for use of the Office Space and the Services for each month of occupancy by the NH Department of Education (NHED). A final invoice is due within 30 days of the end of this contract. Invoices and reports shall be submitted electronically to:

G. Contract Terms: The College shall make the Office Space and Services available to State for a period of twelve months, on a month-to-month basis, commencing on December 16, 2023, through December 15, 2024, subject to the provision, below.

Early Termination of Cooperative Project Agreement, as Extended by this Amendment: That certain Cooperative Project Agreement dated effective August 16, 2021, by and between the Granite State College of the University System of New Hampshire and the State of New Hampshire, as subsequently amended and as most recently amended hereby, shall automatically terminate upon the execution of a Purchase and Sale Agreement by and between the University System of New Hampshire and the State of New Hampshire for the State's purchase of all of the land and improvements owned by the University System of New Hampshire located at 25 Hall Street, Concord, New Hampshire, of which the Premises leased hereunder are a part. Said Purchase and Sale Agreement shall include a provision extending the State's leasehold rights granted by said Cooperative Project Agreement, as amended hereby, up to and until the closing of the transaction contemplated by said Purchase and Sale Agreement, on all of the same terms and provisions set forth herein. Upon execution of the Purchase and Sale Agreement, such lease extension provision shall supersede said Cooperative Project Agreement, as amended hereby. All of the rights and obligations of the parties hereunder, including, without limitation, the State's monthly rent payment obligation, shall otherwise continue uninterrupted and unaffected by the terms of said Purchase and Sale Agreement, except for the contemplated realignment of the lease termination date with the closing of the contemplated purchase and sale transaction.

H. Additional Terms: The Premises are leased "as is" and as furnished. The State is responsible for care maintenance and upkeep of the Premises, the Furniture, Fixtures and Equipment (FF&E), including Audio Visual and IT Infrastructures. The State will be able to reserve conference/classroom spaces in the first-floor classrooms and second floor Event Center (at no additional cost). Room 302, the Board Room, has a custom conference table designed for the space which shall be maintained as is. The College may reserve this space for select meetings at no cost.

EXHIBIT B

This Project Agreement is funded under a Grant/Contract/Cooperative Agreement to State from the Federal sponsor specified in Project Agreement article F.
